Perth y Pia Brecon Beacons Perth Y Pia Outdoor Centre, Llanbedr, Crickhowell NP18 1SY

Walking: From the farmhouse you can get straight on to the hill -Table Mountain is just out the back and the Beacons are but a short drive. Sugar Loaf is also handy as are the Black Mountains and Waun Fach, the highest point locally. So many fine routes, expect some panoramic views, some classic walking and some excellent company for the weekend. Climbing: With 78 routes, mainly on limestone, the Llangattock Escarpment (Eastern Edge) extends for 3mls along the valley overlooking Crickhowell. Some old quarries, generally solid. Exposed and cold when windy, pleasant if calm and sunny. Routes up to 43m, notable for Liberator (E3 6a) and Roaring Eighties (E5 6a).

MTB: A 21 mile loop from the barn. Starting with some stiff climbing on quite lanes before heading off road above Grwyn Farw, descending then climbing through Mynydd Du Forest to the top of Crug Mawr....

Cycling: Llangenny and Crickhowell circuit. This is a good spin to a nice pub, or a great circa one hour blast through pretty lanes and countryside. Best to refer to a map. Llanelly hamlet /Gilwern. Straight over A4077 and via Llangrwney to Langenny.

BEDS: 16 ... 3x 4 bed, 1x 3 bed, 1x1 bed.

COST: £35 for the weekend plus around £4 if we group cater Sat night. MORE INFO: Perth-y-Pia is a stone built, 15th century farmhouse and barn sitting on the slopes of Table Mountain. The buildings have been renovated to provide comfort and homeliness, whilst retaining original features such as oak beams, an old hearth and a bread oven. Well equipped, with electric ovens, gas hobs and dishwashers. Separate showers and toilets. STUFF you need to know: If the weather is with us we'll have a barbecue. Don't forget your sleeping bag and tucker for the weekend. BEST PUB : The Red Lion in Llanbedr 1 mile or Crickhowell 2ml.
